camp grounds. about 6 G.M.C.A.'s
for the whole camp. Every night
we have some kind of an enter-
tainment at this. you ought to
hear the bunch yell. The bunch
up here say they wish they were
in D.C. for just one night
some of them are sure gone sick.
It sure is funny to hear how
some of the fellows talk southern
eastern western ferg. Our bunch
was given credit for being the
best regiment of alaromed soldiers
in camp.
